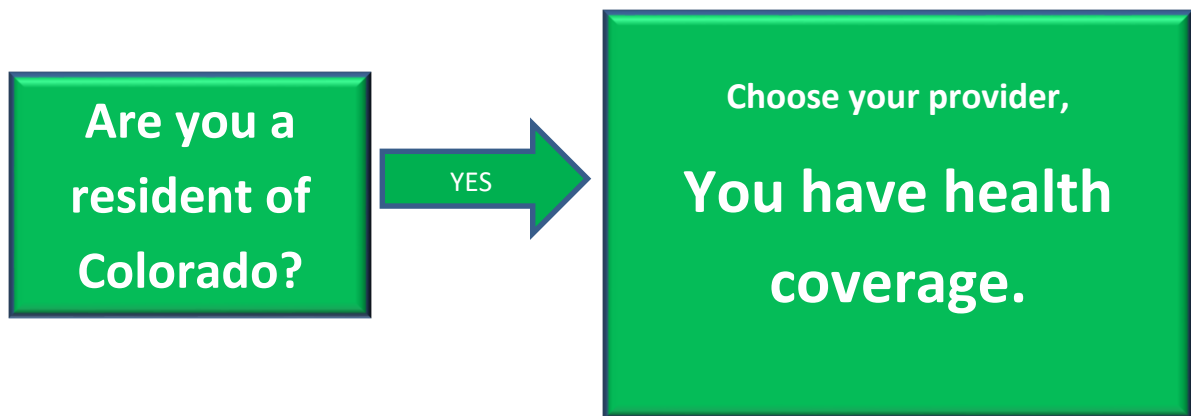


Sign-Up Process for Health Coverage under ColoradoCare As Contrasted with Health Coverage under the Affordable Care Act



ColoradoCare, Amendment 69:

- ColoradoCare, Amendment 69 is a proposal for a coordinated, networked statewide health care system on the November 8 ballot for the voters of Colorado.
- Coloradans will pay premiums based on a percentage of payroll and income taxes. Everyone pays something, but always what they can afford at each point in their lives.
- ColoradoCare will provide for affordable, comprehensive health care for each Coloradan regardless of employment, marital, financial, or health status. There are no deductibles and few co-pays, always waived in cases of financial need.
- With ColoradoCare you won't receive medical bills or denials—you'll receive medical care.
- Health care professionals will enjoy the simplified billing, the ability to make treatment decisions directly with the patient, and they will no longer need to provide charity care—they will be paid.
- ColoradoCare saves money and actually costs less than the current system by removing layers of bureaucracy, unjustified profits and salaries, and fraud and waste.
- Section 1332 of the Affordable Care Act invites states to create their own health care financing systems.
- ColoradoCare is **not** government-run. Providers can choose to be public or private; non-profit or for-profit; salaried or independent. As with a cooperative business, the members (all the residents of Colorado) own ColoradoCare. Members, not the federal or state governments, govern the ColoradoCare. Fair election and campaign rules will ensure that Trustees are chosen based on their skills and leadership rather than on outside influence and big money.
